### 2: Hazardous Identification

### 4: First Aid Measures

<b>General</b>	For advice, contact a Poisons Information Centre (Australia 13 11 26) or a doctor.
<b>Ingestion</b>	If swallowed, DO NOT induce vomiting. If person is conscious, rinse mouth thoroughly with water first then give a glass of water to drink. If vomiting occurs, wash out mouth again with water and give another glass of water to drink. Seek medical attention if irritation persists.

### 11: Toxicological Information

<b>Ingestion</b>	LD50 (rat) – 13.8g/kg (Quaternary coco alkylamine ethoxylate) LD50 (rat) – 32.0g/kg (Sodium Edetate). Product is considered to be of low toxicity. Ingestion of large amounts may cause irritation to the oesophagus and cause gastrointestinal upset.
<b>Eye</b>	Eye irritation (Draize, rabbit): severely irritating. Vascularisation of the cornea was observed when; undiluted (100%) similar ingredients were applied to the eyes of rabbits. As this is considered a permanent effect, the studies were terminated. The chemicals were considered to be severely irritating to the eye (HERA, 2009). The irritants in this product are dilute (<10%).
<b>Skin</b>	The ingredients contained in this product exhibit low acute dermal toxicity. Low irritation to the skin. However may cause reddening of the skin, rashes or dermatitis on prolonged skin contact.
<b>Inhalation</b>	The ingredients in this product have low acute inhalation toxicity. In non-guideline studies reported in HERA (2009) the surfactants contained in this product had a LC50 values in rats that exceeded the saturated vapour concentration in air. There were no mortalities reported.

### 12: Ecological Information

<b>Ecotoxicity</b>	EC50 – Trout >800mg/L (96 hours) product. EC50 – Algae >130mg/L (96 hours) product.
<b>Persistence/Degradability</b>	The substance is expected to be readily biodegradable according to the OECD test 301 protocol.
<b>Bio-accumulative Potential</b>	Expected to have limited potential to bio-accumulate.
<b>Mobility in Soil</b>	Expected to be mobile in soil.
